If you can devote a few hours before the end of the year to become informed on one of your favorite subjects, you can gain certification. [Note: MAMGA Board members are required to be certified.]

To report your education and (optional this year) volunteer hours, go to https://mastergardener.extension.wisc.edu/report-your-hours/. You may recall last January all current master gardeners had to "enroll" in the Master Gardener volunteer program. You will need to go to the Online Reporting System to enroll again for 2021 after January 1st.

As you will see in the MAMGA Board minutes for the December 7th board meeting, we have decided to have a virtual annual membership meeting. We have secured a keynote speaker, and we will be doing a very short business meeting. The Annual Meeting will require registration on the MAMGA web site which will be available on the web site in early January. The meeting will be free this year. We have scheduled the meeting for Saturday, February 27th at 9 am to 10:30 am. It will be delivered on Zoom. So, for the first time, any of you going south in February can attend the meeting wherever you might be using a computer, tablet or smart phone.

Easy 2020 Certification Process

Thanks to Covid19, no volunteer hours were required this year so ten hours of education is all that's needed to become certified for 2021. It is a great opportunity for you to recertify your MGV status. The deadline for putting your continuing education hours in the MGV database is noon on December 31st at https://volunteers.wimastergardener.org/vms/sec_Login/. If you haven't done this before, you can apply for a password at this website and get your hours recorded. Be sure to Save each entry. There may be a slight delay between entering the data and seeing it displayed. Each time you log in, you will see your total hours. There are also instructional videos that show you how to register.

MAMGA Board Minutes - Draft 4:00-5:30 December 7, 2020 Zoom Meeting (EIN 39-1694554)

- 1. Review and approval of October minutes Moved by Victoria and seconded by Art.
- 2. <u>Treasurer's Report</u> Art provided a summary of the budget and indicated a 70% increase in donations over last year. But there will be a significant drop in revenue due to lack of a 2021 MG class and continuing membership non-renewals. However, Art reported that we are very financially secure because of minimal expenses. Revenue from the Annual Meeting Silent Auction will be left at zero, with any income being a pleasant surprise. Two CDs coming due will be left for one additional year
- 3. <u>Membership Renewals</u>: We have approximately 200 renewals. Ed has sent emails to 2019 and 2020 non-renewals. He will send an additional reminder at the end of December. In

- January, Dennis will send membership cards, 2021 program schedule and Annual Meeting information.
- 4. **2021 Programs** Ed has sent the latest schedule, a mixture of virtual and outdoor classes. There was discussion regarding a volunteer recognition in 2021. Lisa was flexible with dates.
- 5. Annual Meeting Virtual meeting scheduled for February 27, beginning at 9:00. Art suggest 6 working groups to organize the event including Business meeting, Community Grants, Silent Auction, Meeting schedule, technology and Board elections. Much of the business portion will be conducted ahead of time. Elections may be conducted by Zoom Poll. The 2 completed Community Grants will each give a 5-7 minute pre-recorded presentation and include information about how they worked during COVID. . B'Ann suggested a pairing with Blue Plate/Annual Meeting for an additional source of income. Ed will check with Cheri Schweitzer regarding the current status. We will add this possibility to one of the Annual Meeting work groups. There was a discussion of Annual Meeting participants making a voluntary \$5 or \$10 donation to either the Community Grants or Signature Project or some aspect of MAMGA.
- 6. **Community Grants** Mary will help with reviewing applications for 2021. So far, no applications have been received.
- 7. **Nomination Committee** There will be one Board opening with a likely candidate. Victoria will send a request for bios/photos.
- 8. MOU/MGV Certification and On-boarding Ed forwarded Mike's response. It appears that no immediate action is necessary. Ed and Lisa will continue to question Mike about the impact on MAMGA. Ed reported on his research regarding MOU. Lisa emphasized that certification and education need to be paired for maximum impact along with social and networking possibilities.
- 9. Other B'Ann attended the WIMGA meeting and will summarize. WIMGA did approve the by-law changes regarding categories of members. Dennis will send MAMGA brochure PDF to Lisa for printing. Lisa will ask Mike about auto reply/confirmation for members after they submit certification hours.
